STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

As part of the New Jersey Department of Education's plans to survey all core curriculum content areas not included in the statewide assessment program, we are conducting the New Jersey Visual and Performing Arts Survey. The Visual and Performing Arts Education Survey is part of a broader New Jersey Arts Education Census Project, a partnership among the New Jersey Department of Education, the New Jersey State Council on the Arts, the Geraldine R. Dodge Foundation, New Jersey Arts Education Partnership, ArtPride New Jersey and Quadrant Arts Education Research. This partnership will provide schools, policy makers, and community leaders with an analysis of arts education while at the same time *providing schools, districts and communities with tools and resources to strengthen student learning in the arts.*
